

Scholarship Terms & Conditions

Healing Trauma, Restoring Connection – Trauma-Informed Couples Therapy Training 8–9 November 2025 | Crow's Nest Community Centre, Sydney

1. Overview

The Australian Resource Therapy Institute (ARTI) is offering scholarships to support therapists to attend *Healing Trauma*, *Restoring Connection* – *Trauma-Informed Couples Therapy Training*, presented by **Maureen McEvoy**, **MA**, **RCC** (Canada), International Imago Faculty.

This opportunity is designed to enhance access to professional training for counsellors, psychologists, psychotherapists, and allied health professionals working with couples.

2. Scholarship allocation

A total of **10 scholarships** are available:

- 5 full-fee scholarships covering the complete tuition fee (value \$1250 each)
- 5 half-fee scholarships covering 50% of the tuition fee (value \$625 each)

Each scholarship place includes:

- Full workshop tuition (as per allocation)
- Training materials provided
- 12 CPD hours eligible with PACFA, ACA, APS, AASW, AAPI, ASCH

Scholarships do **not** cover travel, accommodation, meals, or other personal expenses.

3. Eligibility

Applications are open to:

- Registered and provisional psychologists
- Counsellors and psychotherapists (PACFA, ACA, AASW, AAPI, APS members)
- Allied health professionals working therapeutically with couples



Applicants must be over 18 years of age.

4. Application process

To apply, applicants must:

- 1. Select the crew character part they most identify with (e.g. Foggy Fran, Burnout Baxter, Not-Enough Nellie)
- 2. Write 100 words explaining why this character resonates and how they will apply the training in practice
- 3. Submit their entry via email to philipa@resourcetherapy.com.au by 15 October 2025

Late applications cannot be accepted.

5. Selection process

- All applications will be reviewed by an ARTI faculty panel.
- Successful applicants will be notified by 20 October 2025.
- Selection will be based on the alignment between applicants' reflection and the training's professional development aims.
- All decisions are final and at the discretion of ARTI.
- Scholarships are non-transferable and not redeemable for cash.

This scholarship supports participation in professional development training. It does not guarantee therapeutic outcomes or specific professional advancement.
